


Hike Canada En Marche A Year in Review 2023-24



OUR VALUES

To promote the development and use of a Canada-wide system of trails open to the public that offer both Canadians and visitors access to the natural beauty and cultural heritage of the country's diverse regions, as well as facilitating a form of exercise that is physically and mentally beneficial.

IN STEP WITH NATURE

Hike Canada on the national trail system dedicated to hiking, snowshoeing and backpacking. Well-trodden or rugged, there are 3800km of operable trail with many more tracts of public lands awaiting designation. Once established coast to coast, the trail corridor will offer a contrasting array of heritage of natural landscapes and historic places, and provide passage, habitat, and refuge for wildlife.

From a 1971 meeting of national outdoor organizations, with the slogan "Towards a Foot Trail across Canada", the National Hiking Trail was launched officially at a ceremony in Ottawa in 1987. Piece by piece, the scenic 10,000 kilometre footpath is growing between the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans, and our long-held vision of a natural corridor connecting existing natural-surface pedestrian trail systems with parklands and wild places is becoming a reality.


